Do you want to make a difference in TU Dublin? Do you want to lead positive change?


It's time to nominate yourself for a Students' Union Officer role for the Academic year 23/24!



#### Student Council



Student Council is the highest decision-making body of TU Dublin Students' Union, and it consists of Students from all campuses. They decide on the direction of the Union, and debate on motions and policies for the SU Officers to work on. In the last months, Council has for example mandated the Union to lobby for more seating areas for all campuses, to hold a Climate Emergency Campaign and to lobby for Earlier Leaving Cert results. # **USI Updates**





Your SU team has been attending USI National Council since the start of the year, representing all the students in TU Dublin on issues that they face. We've put forward many motions for the USI team to work on, ranging from education and welfare issues to overall student representation.



For those of you who don't know, USI Comhdhaíl/Congress is a four-day event where approximately 300 students and SU Officers across the island of Ireland debate and vote on motions and policies to direct the work of USI for the next 3 years. Think of it like our own Student Council but on a national level. We have a certain amount of seats given to us based on the population of students in TU Dublin, which involves all the Full-Time SU Officers and students from our Student Council who apply for a seat. This year it will be in the Clayton Hotel in Co. Sligo from the 3rd – 6th of April.
