Canteen Protest





Last Semester, Student Council passed a motion mandating the Students' Union to hold a university-wide protest about the canteen services in TU Dublin. Demands included the provision of additional microwaves, student-friendly prices, and more seating, to name just a few. The protest was due to go ahead this Wednesday (12pm, 1st February) but has now been postponed, pending positive discussions with the University to resolve these issues. We'll keep you posted on the outcome of these negotiations, but for now, this represents ongoing partnership between the University and your Students' Union.




Hello all!

Our annual Raising and Giving week takes place the week of the 27th of February. We have plenty of campus activities happening for to you to enjoy. Some of these include our:


- Candy floss and popcorn days
