Upcoming Assessments and SU Support

The President spoke on the S.U's efforts to work with the University and ensure that student's grades are not impacted negatively as a result of the virus. Nothing is definite yet. An Academic Council meeting is scheduled for Tuesday the 28th where the no detriment policy will hopefully be passed. If passed this means that students who received a certain grade in the first semester of a module should not receive a lower result than that at final results. A higher grade average would be honoured. A rep queried about pending assignments with much higher module weightings than previous assignments. The President advised that the totality of grades will potentially be looked at across all modules. This is all being discussed at present and Tuesday's Academic Council should provide decisions and definite answers.
