The Executive discussed their positions on the upcoming affiliation	
referendum taking place in March which will ask the Student Body	
whether they want the SU to remain in USI or to leave USI.	
The VP for Communications and Media commenced discussion noting	
their reluctance to create a "Leave" stance. Asking where TUD SU can do	
better without USI, the VP recommended exhausting all options before	
deciding to leave USI.	

The VP for Academic Affairs insisted that the SU must reevaluate membership due to the in-praxis service USI actually gives.

The VP for Welfare and Equality noted that outside of USI, TUD SU will not be capable of holding the national-level Union to account and that TUD SU representation is necessary to maintaining such an order. Noting succeeding Executives, the VP believes in giving future Executive's the opportunity to hold USI accountable on a national level.

The City VP for Tallaght noted TUD SU's large membership, amounting to nearly 30,000 students, believing that the student body is large enough for TUD SU to stand-alone, like UCD and UL do, outside of USI.

The President noted all above-concerns and commented on the organisational structure of USI. The President believes UCD receive more media attention due to their position outside of USI and if TUD SU follow suit, this would be effective and beneficial for TUD SU's media exposure.

TUD SU spend 140,000 euro per annum on USI membership with limited actions being taken on the national level.

The President believes this Referendum gives the Student Body the opportunity to acknowledge and recognise what USI actually is, and also gives USI the opportunity to display their Union to TUD students.

The VP for Events and Engagement sourced the argument that USI on a national level have limited powers and the President seconded that the student representation is ineffective.

The Executive voted by majority by Secret Ballot that the stance of the TUD SU is to Leave the USI.
